Are there three cups of tea?

5. There is, there are: with answers

Is there much water in the war?

No, there isn't.

Are there 3 dogs in the yard?

No, there aren't. Just one.

6. Past Simple: something which started in the past and finished in the past.

I arrived at school late

She didn't do the homework

They were at the park yesterday.

8. Past progressive: For longer actions

While I was driving I saw a cat

She was listening to music when she heard a strange sound.

They were playing baseball when something hit one of the elements of the team

9. Used to: action or habit in the PAST that is not longer in the present.

I used to watch cartoons when i was four years old.

She used to take piano leassons

We used to live in this neigbourhood

10 .CAN and COULD: Ability / Capability

You can go to the cinema.

Smoking can cause cancer.

Can I have a biscuit, please?

.COULD Ability / Capability

Past I could swim when I was seven.

Permission We could go to the cinema once a week.

Possibility This vase could be very valuable.

Request Could I use your phone, please?

Offer Could I be of any help?

Suggestion You could buy Mary some flowers.
